

CJNS/RCÉN Editor's annual report for CAANS/ACAÉN virtual CAANS Executive Meeting, July 3, 2021

Issues published

- The most recent issue is Volume 40, Issue 2 (2020), a special issue of 205 pages on the 75th anniversary of the liberation of the Netherlands and the end of World War II.

Titled *Seventy-five years after the end of World War II: Looking back, being in the pandemic present*, it contains five peer-reviewed articles and twelve book reviews. These include topics concerning the ethics of Covid-19 care rationing in the Netherlands, Liberation in the Netherlands and the ensuing colonial war in the Dutch East Indies, the postcolonial work of writer Beb Vuyk, the Jewish hiding experience in Dutch fiction, the Dutch theologian Willem A. Visser 't Hooft's role in the Swiss Road underground resistance and communication route, as well as discussions regarding fascism, Nazi looting, the Holocaust, survival stories, and monuments. The issue was well received, as evidenced by the positive and appreciative emails sent to the editor by a number of journal readers and contributors.

Issues planned

- Volume 41, Issue 1 (2021) is forthcoming in July with one peer-reviewed article and a record number of book reviews (around twenty-eight), spanning topics from art history to science.
- Volume 41, Issue 2 (2021) is planned for the late fall of 2021/early winter of 2022 and will contain the Proceedings from the virtually held annual meeting at the 2021 Congress of the Humanities and Social Sciences, hosted by the University of Alberta. Dr. Tanja Collet will be the guest editor for this special Proceedings issue, which is themed around 1) linguistics and translation studies; 2) literary studies; and 3) historical studies.
- Volume 42, Issue 1 (2022) may include at least two articles that have been peer-reviewed through the double-blind review process and are currently being revised by each of the authors.

Editorial board

Each of the eight members of the editorial board is expected to subject submissions to the journal that are based on papers delivered at the 2021 CAANS annual meeting to an internal review for the Proceedings issue.

Editorial support

Former CJNS/RCÉN Editor Dr. Inge Genee has continued to lend support and training for the past year, which was my second year as editor of the journal. Her generous assistance with proofreading, editing, typesetting, and general production of the journal has been provided to me on an ad hoc basis.

Finances

As in previous years, the only permanent expenses related to the journal are our Canadian Association of Learned Journals (CALJ) membership and cost related to the website. However, going forward, I would like to request an annual subscription to Dropbox Plus (CA\$155.88) for cloud storage (2,000 GB) and file sharing to manage the production of the journal. The free Dropbox Basic account used so far exclusively for CJNS files is out of space (2GB). The upgrade would allow me to remain organized and efficient in my work for CJNS, enabling me to archive previous work and to share files through the cloud with those assisting me with the journal.
