In the review article by Allison Blakely about the book *Dutch children of African American liberators: Race, military policy and identity in World War II* (in *Canadian Journal of Netherlandic Studies/Revue canadienne d'études néerlandaises* 42.1: 267-274, <https://caans-acaen.ca/wp-content/uploads/2022/12/CJNS42-1-39-p267-274-Blakely.pdf>), there was an error in the 2nd paragraph of page 271. The author mistakenly identified Jefferson Wiggins as one of the black fathers of the Dutch children featured in the work. He was prominent among the black American soldiers involved but did not father a Dutch child.

The article has been corrected in the PDF of the stand-alone review, but not as part of the whole issue PDF.
